GENERAL RULES

1. All Exhibits entered for Competition must be made or grown by the Exhibitor personally, with the exception of Birds, Animals and Junior Fruit. No Article may be entered for Competition that has been previously exhibited in a Summerland Fall Fair, except Birds, Rabbits and other Livestock.
2. Exhibitors cards will be available at the Fair during Exhibit Entry Times. **PLEASE SEE INDIVIDUAL SECTIONS FOR EXHIBIT ENTRY TIMES.** Exhibitors must fill them out COMPLETELY and they are required to sign a release form. ALL YOUTH AND CHILDREN Exhibit Cards need to have a Parent or Guardian sign a release form. Cards can be purchased ahead of time at the Fall Fair office, 13228 Kelly Avenue during office hours
3. Only ONE ENTRY per Exhibitor in any Class, except Birds and Animals. Only one name per Exhibit Card.
4. An Exhibit Entry fee of fifty cents (\$0.50) will be charged for each adult entry; youth 11-15 will pay a fee of twenty-five cents (\$0.25) for entries into junior categories; no entry fee for children 10 and under when entering a junior category. Any youth entering categories above their age will pay the full cost of that category.
5. The Summerland Exhibition Association will take reasonable care of Exhibits but will not be responsible for loss or damage.
6. Positively No Exhibit may be removed from display before 3:00 pm on Sunday. All Exhibits MUST be removed between 3:00 and 5:00 pm. Perishables not picked up by 5:00 p.m. will be distributed or disposed of. Non-perishables may be picked up at the Fall Fair office until the end of September, at which time they will be disposed of. The Summerland Exhibition Association will not be responsible for Exhibits left in the building after 5:00 pm on Sunday.
7. Prizes are awarded on merit; and not all prizes may be given out. The Judges decision(s) are final.
8. Prize money will be given out at the Awards Ceremonies along with medallions. Prize monies and medallions not given out at this time can be picked up at the Fall Fair office until the Wednesday after the Fair, at which time they will be deemed donated to the Fair. Awards Ceremonies take place Sunday at 2:00 pm on the Main Stage in the Curling Club. Winners of any trophy will have their name engraved on the trophy and will receive a medallion to commemorate the occasion.
9. HIGH AGGREGATE TOTALS are calculated by awarding: Three (3) Points for each First Prize, Two (2) Points for each Second Prize, and One (1) Point for each Third Prize.
10. **FARM AND GARDEN TROPHY** – Highest Total of Prize Points in the Fair by one Exhibitor.

- HELPFUL HINTS -

- Home baking is judged on general appearance, internal appearance of texture, flavour and odour. Wide mouth sealers with metal lids and screw bands give the best results. The sealers need not be new but they must be in like new condition.
- Lids must be new and untarnished. Screw bands must be on the sealers for exhibition, they should also be untarnished. All sealers must be sealed.
- Jelly should be as near as possible to the colour of the fruit from which it was made and it should be transparent with no sediment.
- Jams should have good natural colour with the pulp evenly distributed throughout the height of the jar. Pickle colour should be natural for the vegetable used. Pieces should be of good uniform size. Sourness, sweetness and spiciness should vary accordingly to individual taste, but pickles should never taste flat.
